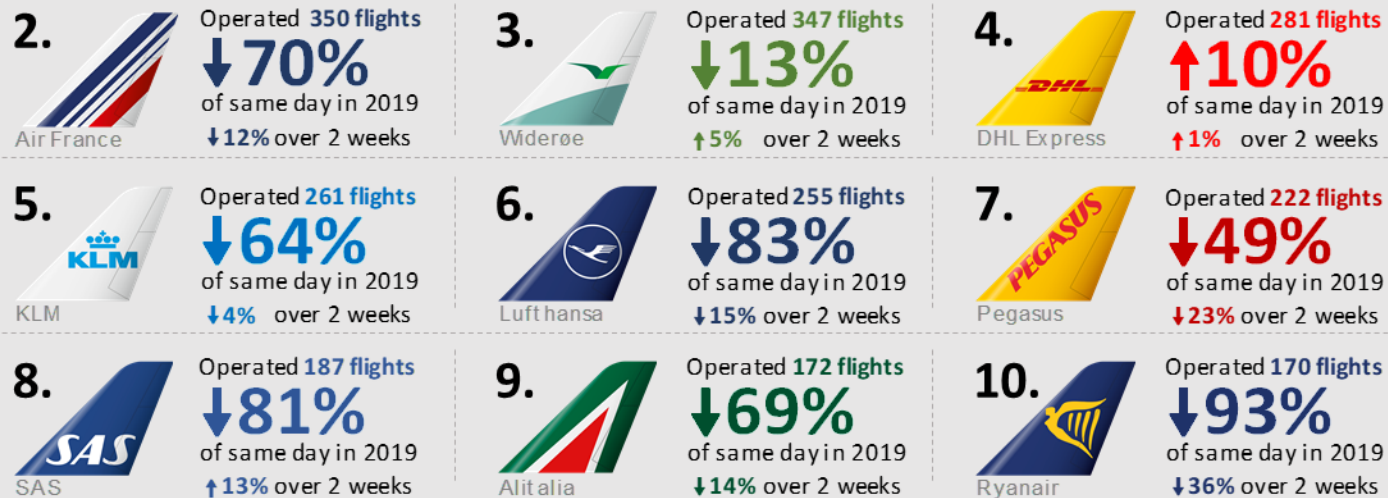


Headlines

- 10,895 flights (35% of 2019 levels) on Wed 21 April 2021, stable (-1%) over 2 weeks.
- Some big States decreased over 2 weeks: Turkey (-17%), Spain -10%) and Italy (-9%). However Germany increased the most (+13%) due to domestic traffic and light aircraft.
- Highest decreases for Turkish Airlines (-13%), Ryanair (-36%), Pegasus (-23%), Air France (-12%) and Lufthansa (-15%). Increase for SAS (+32%). Impact of domestic traffic predominant.
- Highest decreases for Southern airports: Turkish airports and Palma de Mallorca (-31%)
- Domestic traffic vs 2019: Europe (-67%), US (-30%), China (+10%), Middle-East (-45%).

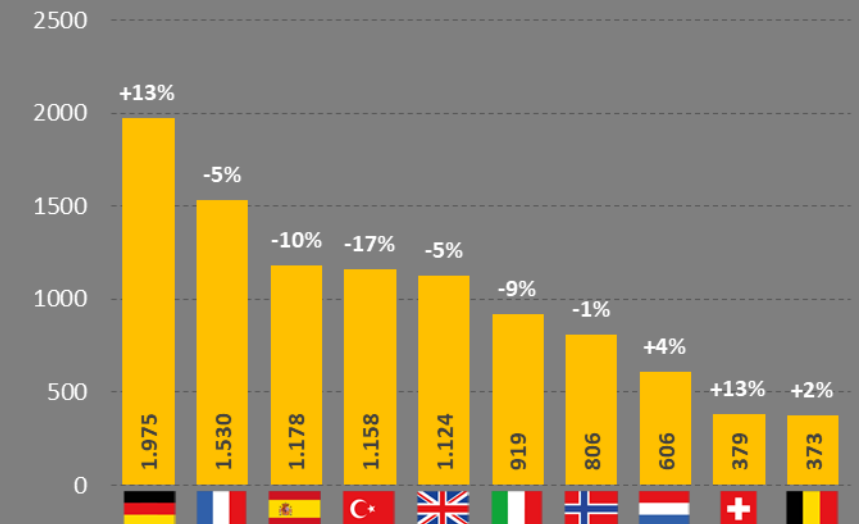

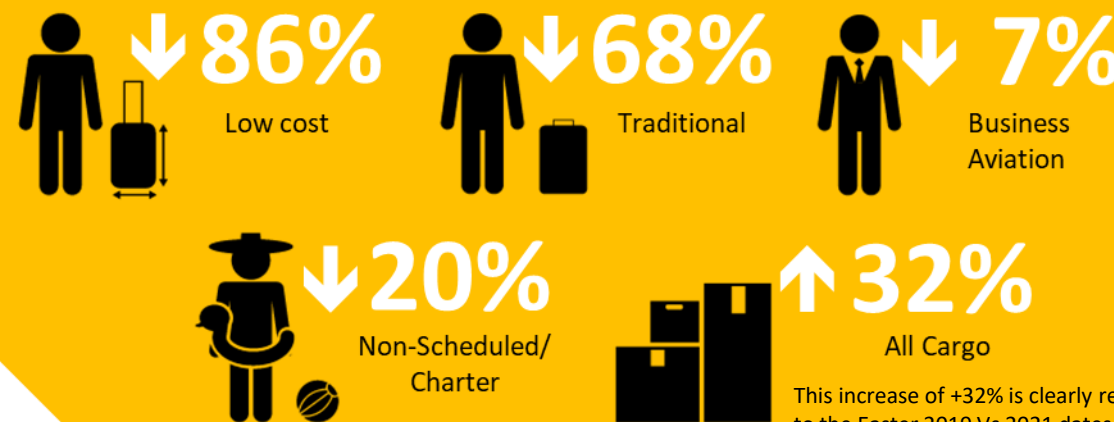

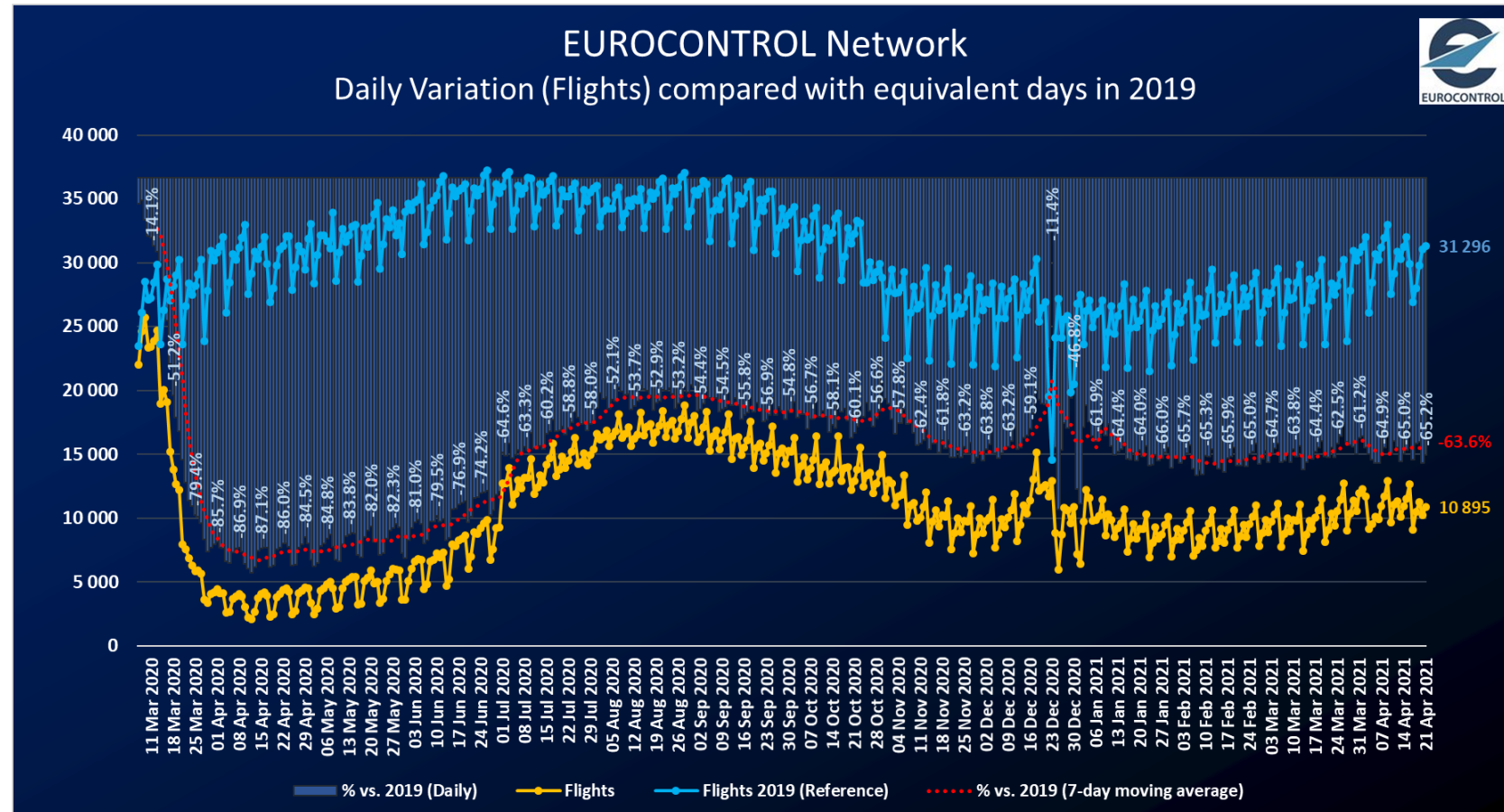

Overall traffic situation at network level



- ✂ **10,895 flights** on Wednesday 21 April.
- ✂ **Stable (-1%)** with **-62 flights** over 2 weeks (from Wed 7 April).
- ✂ **Stable (-0%)** with **-50 flights** over 1 week (from Wed 14 April).
- ✂ **35%** of 2019 traffic levels.



Current situation and scenarios

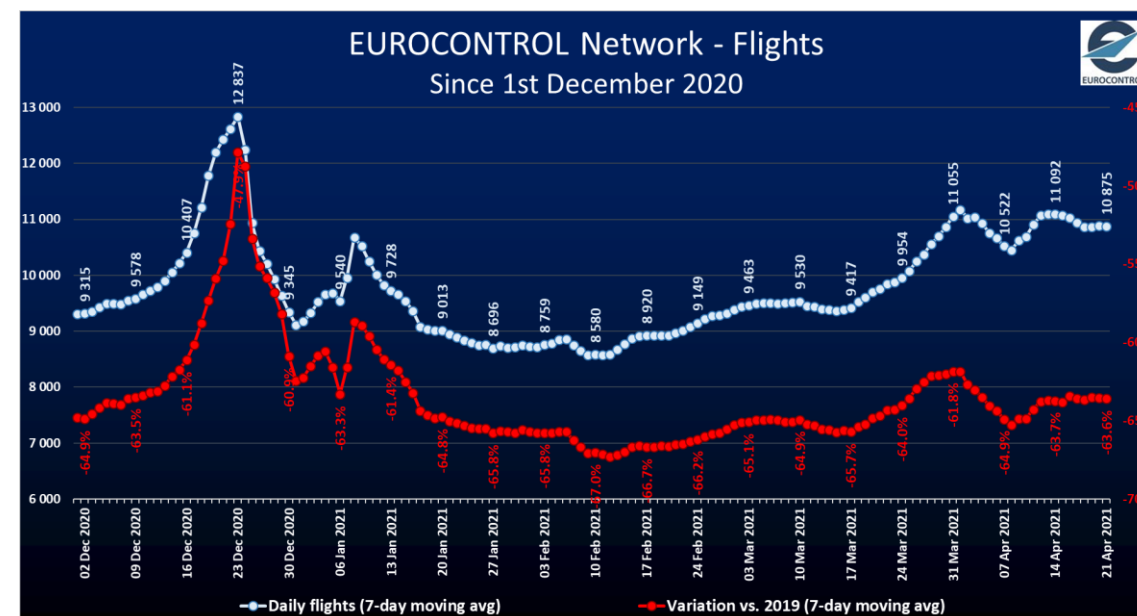
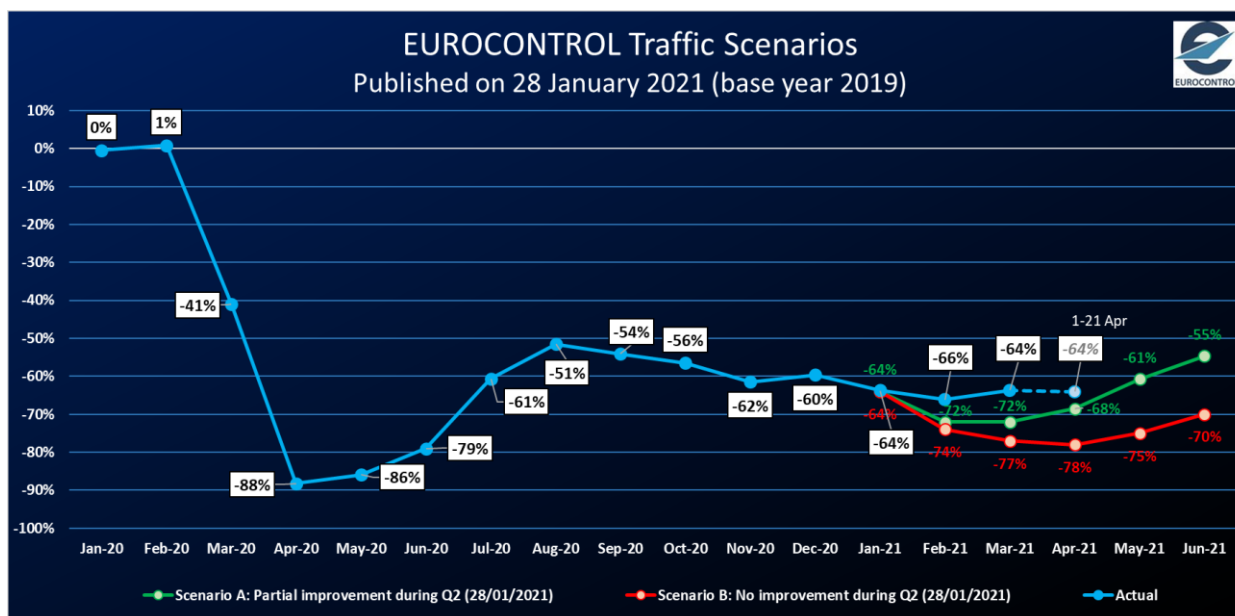
✖ **Traffic at -64% on 1-21 April 2021 vs 1-21 April 2019**, slightly above the latest EUROCONTROL traffic scenarios published on 28 January 2021 mainly due to:

- Very active cargo traffic.
- Easter holidays started in March compared to April in 2019.

Note that a significant proportion of flight operations for some of the largest airlines are actually non-commercial, i.e. training flights and circular flights to maintain pilot ratings.

✖ After having reached a maximum at network level around mid April (around Easter), **the traffic is now stable over the recent days.**

✖ A large part of the recent variations vs 2019 is due to the fact that **Easter this year (4 April 2021) was almost 3 weeks earlier than in 2019 (21 April 2019).**

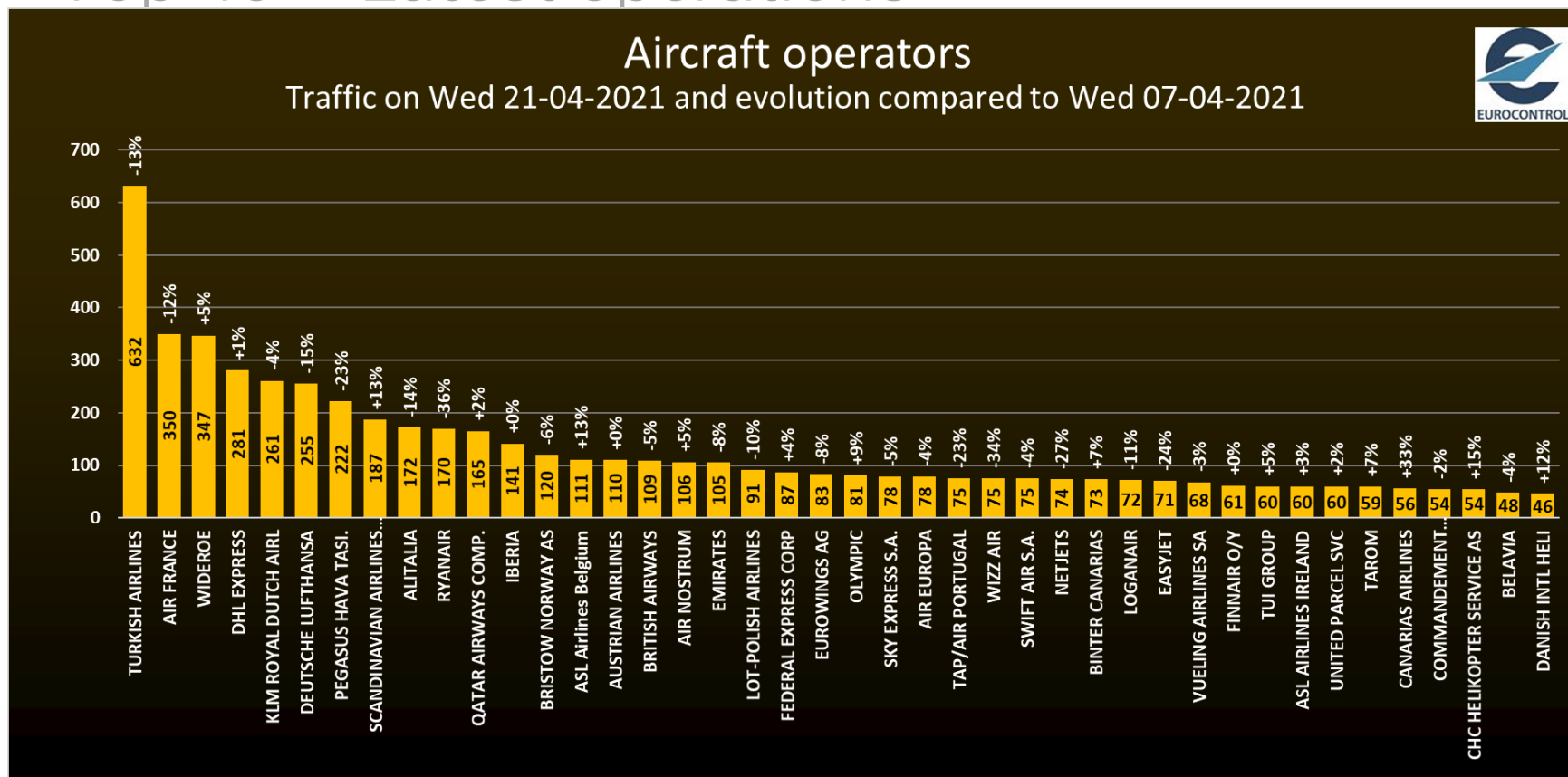

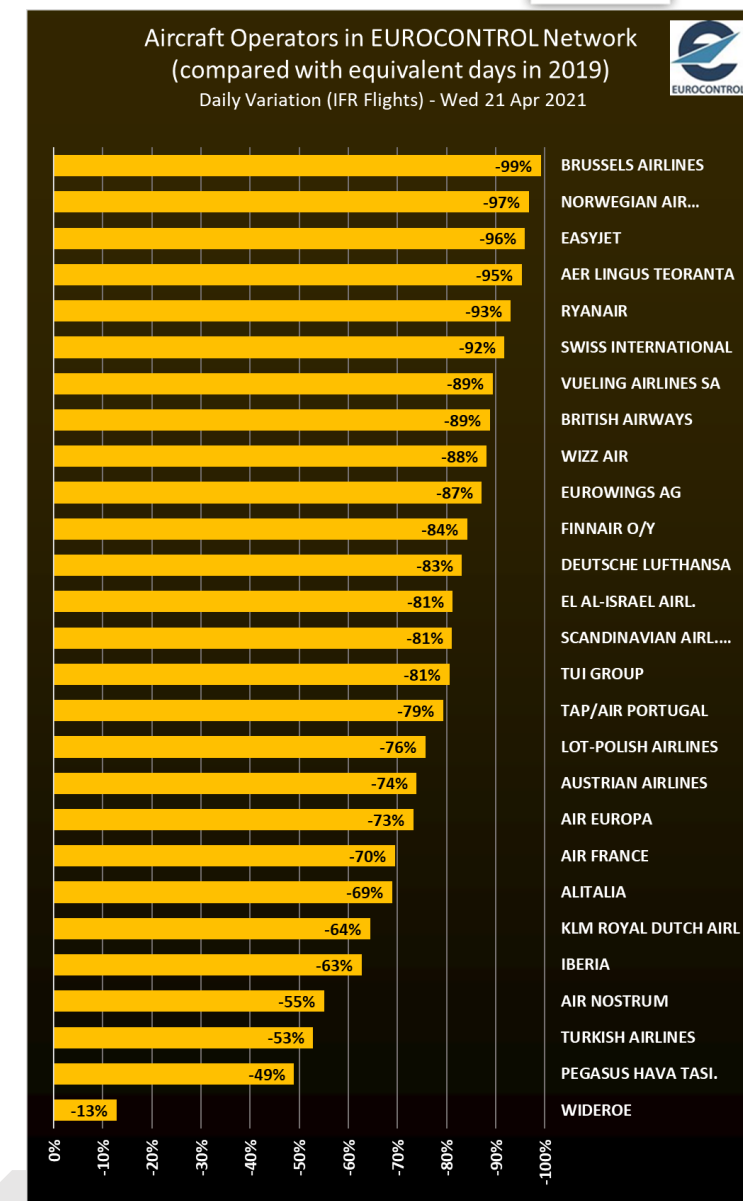
- ✈ **Turkish Airlines** is the busiest airlines despite the highest decrease over 2 weeks (-13%), mainly due to domestic traffic and flows from/to Russia.
- ✈ Positive change in the ranking over 2 weeks for **DHL Express**, **KLM** and **SAS**.
- ✈ Highest decreases for **Turkish Airlines** (-13%), **Ryanair** (-36%) (Domestic Italy), **Pegasus** (-23%) (Domestic Turkey and Turkey-Germany), **Air France** (-12%) (Domestic) and **Lufthansa** (-15%) (flows with Spain).
- ✈ Highest increase for **SAS** (+13%) driven by domestic flows in Sweden, Denmark and Norway.

- ✖ Highest decreases for **Turkish Airlines, Ryanair, Pegasus, Air France, Lufthansa and Wizz Air.**
- ✖ Ryanair 10th, British Airways 16th, Wizz Air 26th and easyJet 31st.
- ✖ Traffic levels ranging from -99% (Brussels Airl.) to -13% (Wideroe) compared to 2019.

Latest news

European airlines

- ✖ **Air France** CEO states that it may raise more capital this year.
- ✖ **British Airways** CEO states that there is an immediate opportunity in terms of the UK/US opening up as a result of their vaccination programmes.
- ✖ **Eurowings** CEO states that the airline will become more pan-European and is in discussions to expand into new bases in the Nordics, Eastern Europe and South Eastern Europe; aims to deploy up to 80 aircraft this summer.
- ✖ **KLM** CFO notes that fleet renewal is a main method of reducing emissions; SAF is still low volume and thus the price is 'extremely high'.
- ✖ **Norwegian** planning a short haul base at Copenhagen, following the closure of its long haul base there.
- ✖ **Ryanair** to appeal EU court rulings on Finnair and SAS state aid.
- ✖ **TAP Air Portugal** resumes services to London Heathrow and to Brazil.
- ✖ **Turkish Airlines** resumes service with the 737 MAX but cancels 10 out its order for 75 737MAX aircraft; another 40 will be converted into options.



- ✖ **Wizz Air** begins services from Kutaisi (in Georgia) to Vilnius and Warsaw; expects to report a net loss of €570-590 million for the year to end March. Expects 'only a gradual recovery into late summer 2021 following what is expected to be a period of good progress of national vaccination plans across key markets'

Worldwide airlines

- ✖ **American Airlines** expects to operate more than 90% of its domestic seat capacity this summer, compared to 2019.
- ✖ **China Airlines** to retire its 747Fs once cargo demand decreases and new 777Fs are delivered.
- ✖ **Delta Airlines** has vaccinated more than 44% of employees and has administered more than 130,000 tests to employees in Q1 2021; reports operating loss of \$1.4 billion in Q1 2021 and net loss of \$1.2 billion.
- ✖ **Qantas Group** expects to exceed 90% of its pre-coronavirus domestic capacity for Q2 2021; preparing for international travel resumption in October.
- ✖ **United Airlines** prices \$4 billion of secured notes at 4.4%/4.6%; reports operating and net loss of \$1.4 billion for Q1 2021.

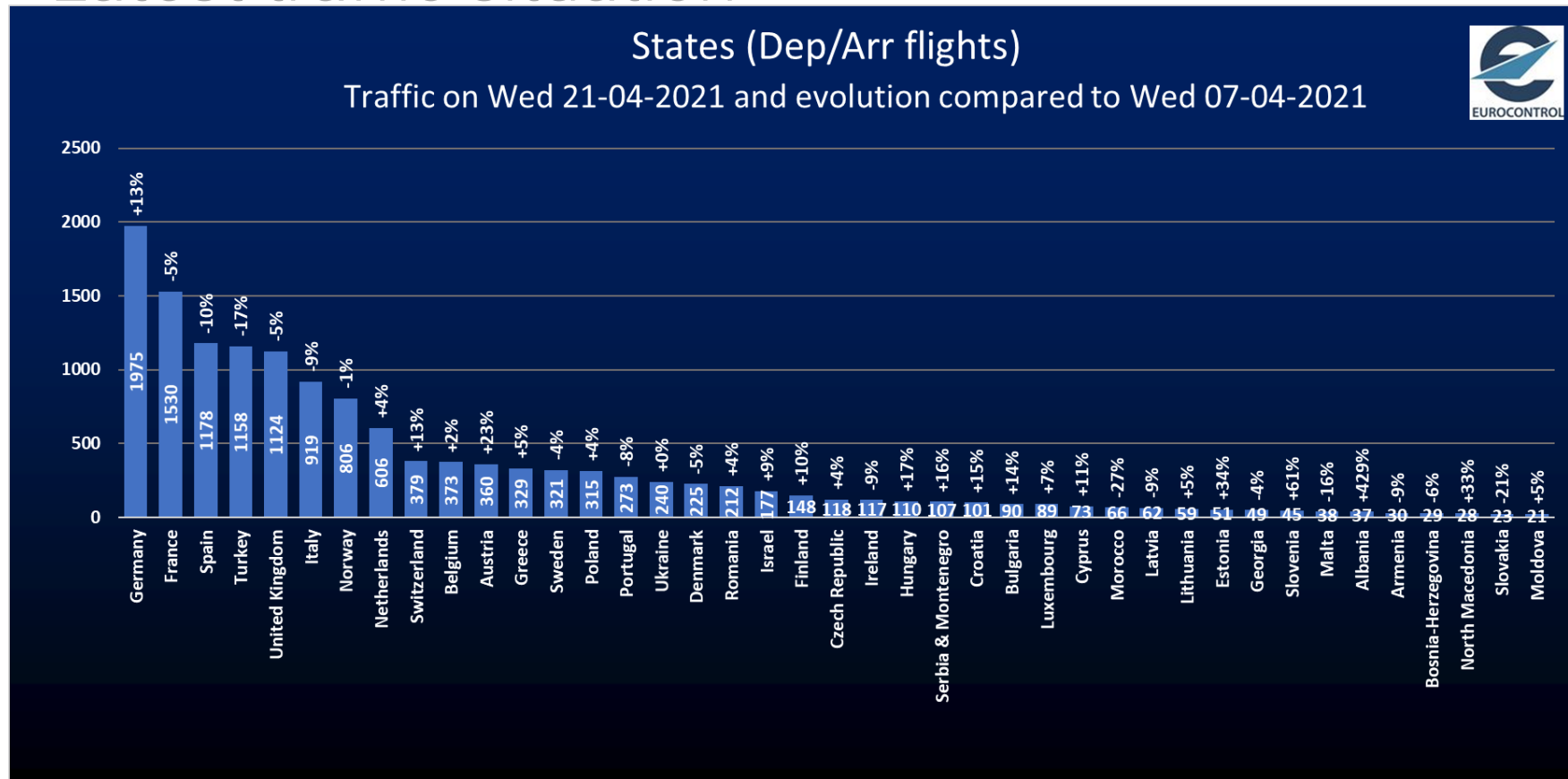
✂ After Easter, **some big States recorded decreases** over 2 weeks:

- **Turkey** (-17%) (Turkish Airlines, Pegasus, Sun Express; Domestic, flows with Russia and Germany).
- **Spain** (-10%) (flows with Germany, Spain and Italy).
- **Italy** (-9%) (Ryanair, Alitalia; Domestic).
- **France** (-5%) (Air France, light aircraft; mainly domestic).
- **UK** (-5%) (many flows notably with Germany, Italy and UK).

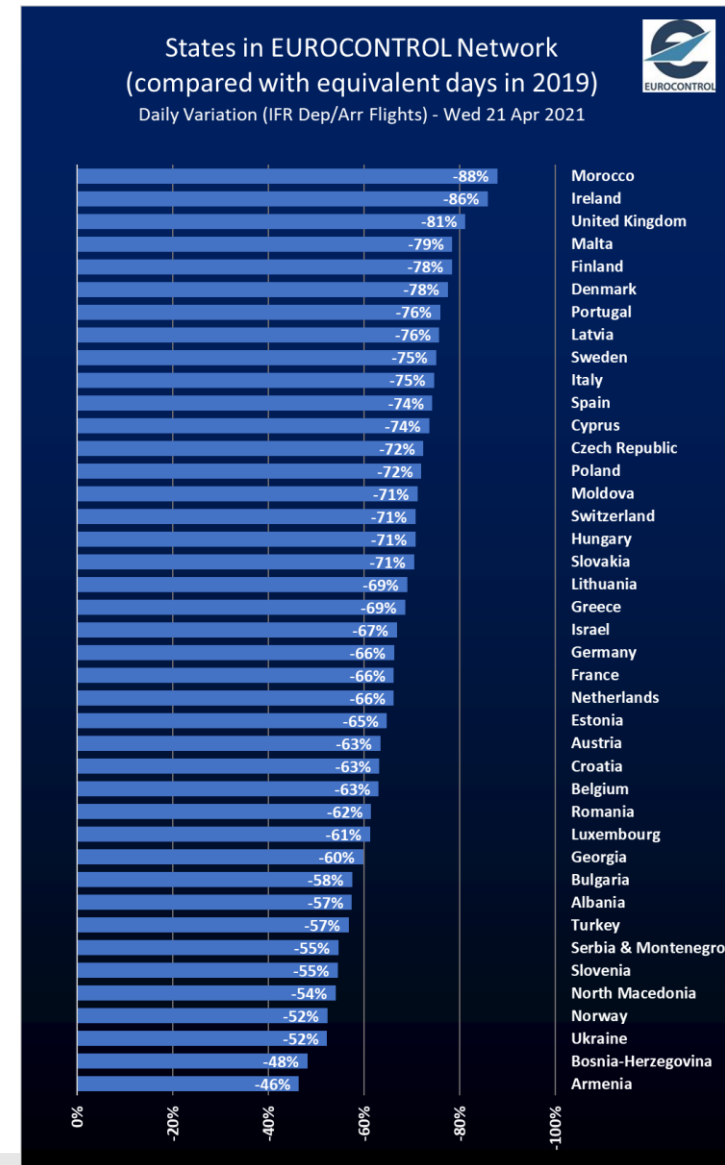
✂ **Highest increase** over 2 weeks for **Germany** (+13%) mainly driven by domestic traffic and light aircraft.

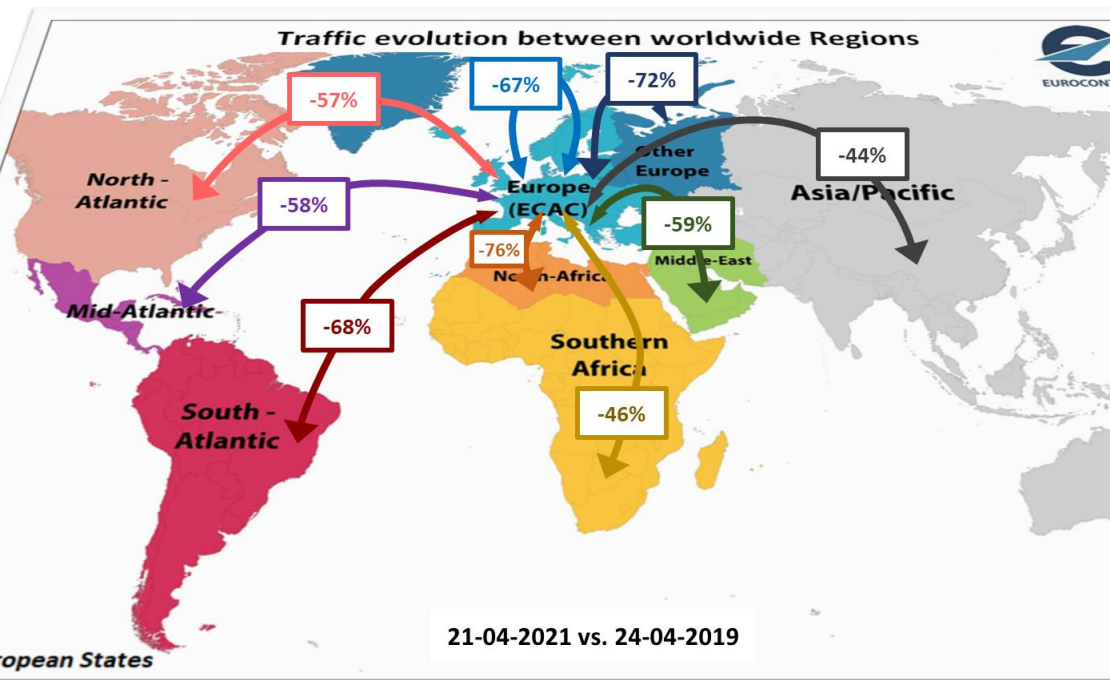
- ✗ Highest decreases for Turkey (-17% over 2 weeks), Spain (-10%), Italy (-9%), France (-5%) and UK (-5%).
- ✗ Highest increases for Germany (+13%), Austria (+23%) and Switzerland (+13%).
- ✗ Traffic levels ranging from -88% (Morocco) to -46% (Armenia) compared to 2019.



- ✂ **Alaska** offers free vaccines to travelers entering the state via major airports, beginning in June.
- ✂ **CAAC** reports China domestic passenger numbers in March were above 2019 level.
- ✂ **Ireland's** Civil Aviation Development Forum publishes an Aviation Restart Plan, with recommendations for government on a traffic light system, exemption from testing/quarantine for fully vaccinated pax and support for the EU Digital Green Pass system.
- ✂ **Morocco** delays the resumption of international flights until the end of Ramadan in mid-May.
- ✂ **New Zealand** allows travelers from Australia to enter without quarantine (already allowed in the other direction).
- ✂ **US** Department of State increases the number of 'Level 4: Do Not Travel' countries to approximately 80% worldwide.

Traffic flows (Daily Departure/Arrival flights)

- ✂ The main traffic flow is the intra-Europe flow with 8,160 flights on Wednesday 21 April, which is increasing (+1%) over 2 weeks.
- ✂ Intra-Europe flights are still 67% below 2019 levels while intercontinental flows are running 61% below.

- ✂ 9 of the top 10 flows are domestic.
- ✂ Highest **increase** in flights over 2 weeks for domestic flows in **Germany** (+113%) mainly due to small aircraft.
- ✂ Highest **decreases** for domestic flows in:
 - **Turkey** (-17%) mainly due to Turkish Airlines, Pegasus and SunExpress.
 - **France** (-10%) mainly due to light aircraft and Air France.
 - **Italy** (-14%) mainly due to Alitalia and Ryanair.

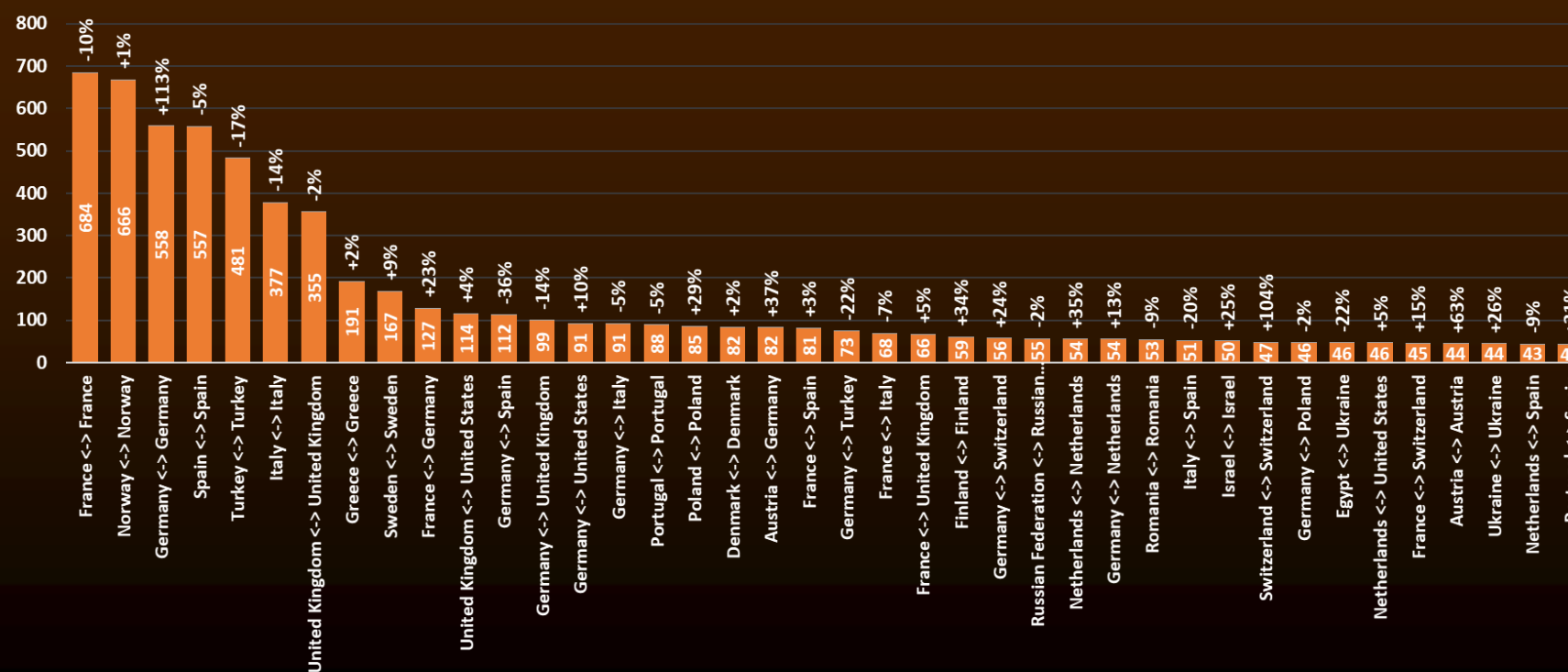
Country pairs (Daily Departure/Arrival flights)

✈ The busiest non-domestic flows were:

- **France-Germany** (127 flights, +23% over 2 weeks).
- **UK-US** (114, +4%).
- **Germany-Spain** (112, -36%).
- **Germany-UK** (99, -14%).
- **Germany-US** (91, +10%).

✈ High decrease for the flow **Turkey-Russia** (-67%) which leaves the Top 40 Country-Pairs

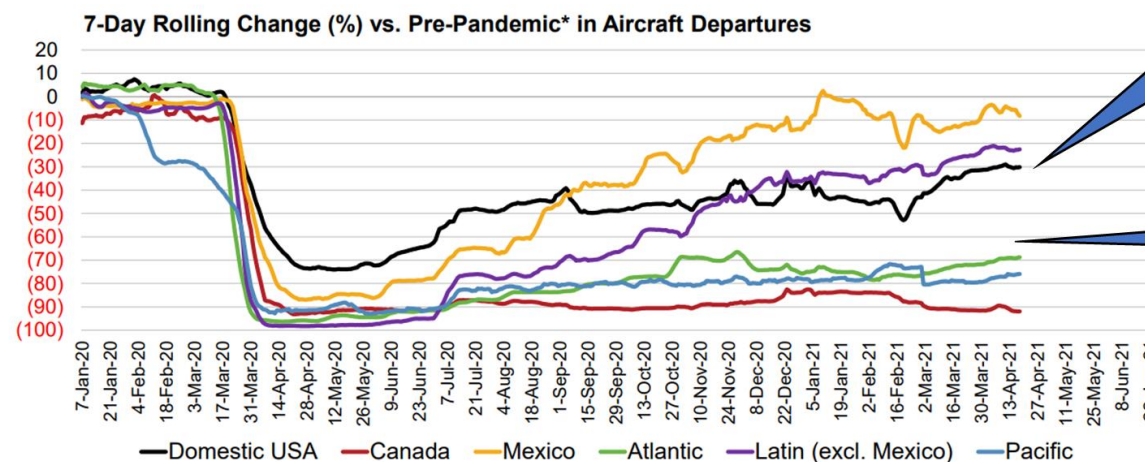


USA

- ✂ Bookings are gradually improving on rising vaccination rates and easing travel restrictions.
- ✂ US domestic recorded a decline of 30% (vs 2019) and international traffic recorded a decline of 43% (vs 2019) on 20 April.
- ✂ On 20 April, US airline passenger volumes were 42% below 2019 levels with domestic down 39% and international down 59%.
- ✂ The domestic US load factor has improved recently, averaging at 73% on most recent week vs 87% in same week of 2019.
- ✂ In March 2021, U.S. International air travel* fell 76% below 2019 levels

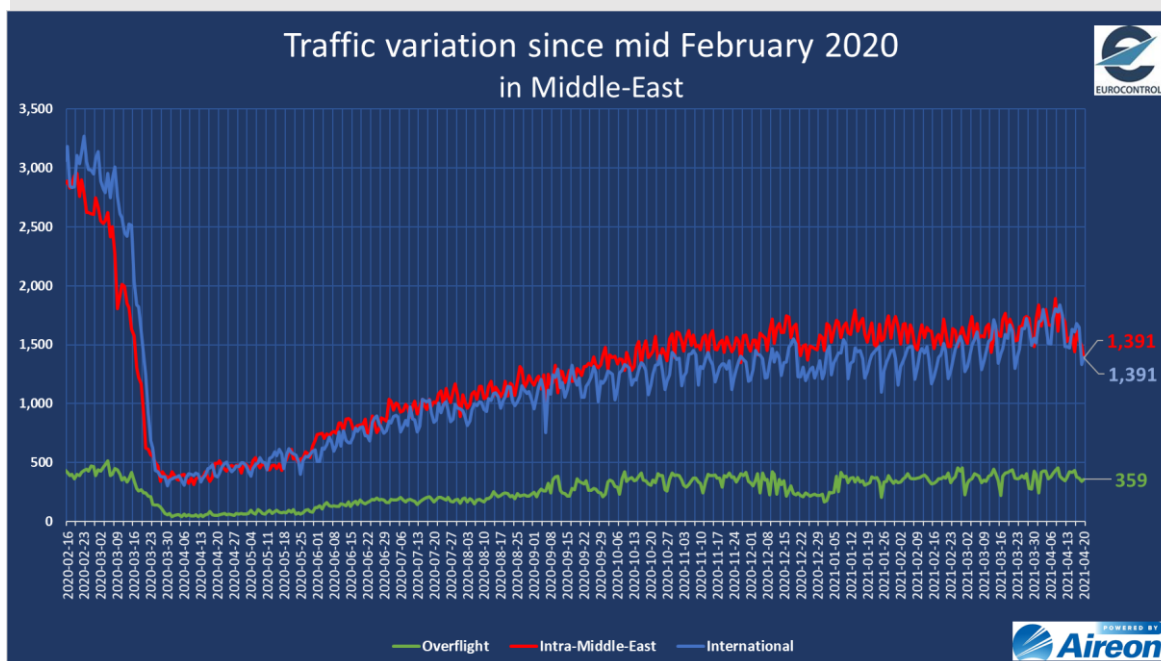

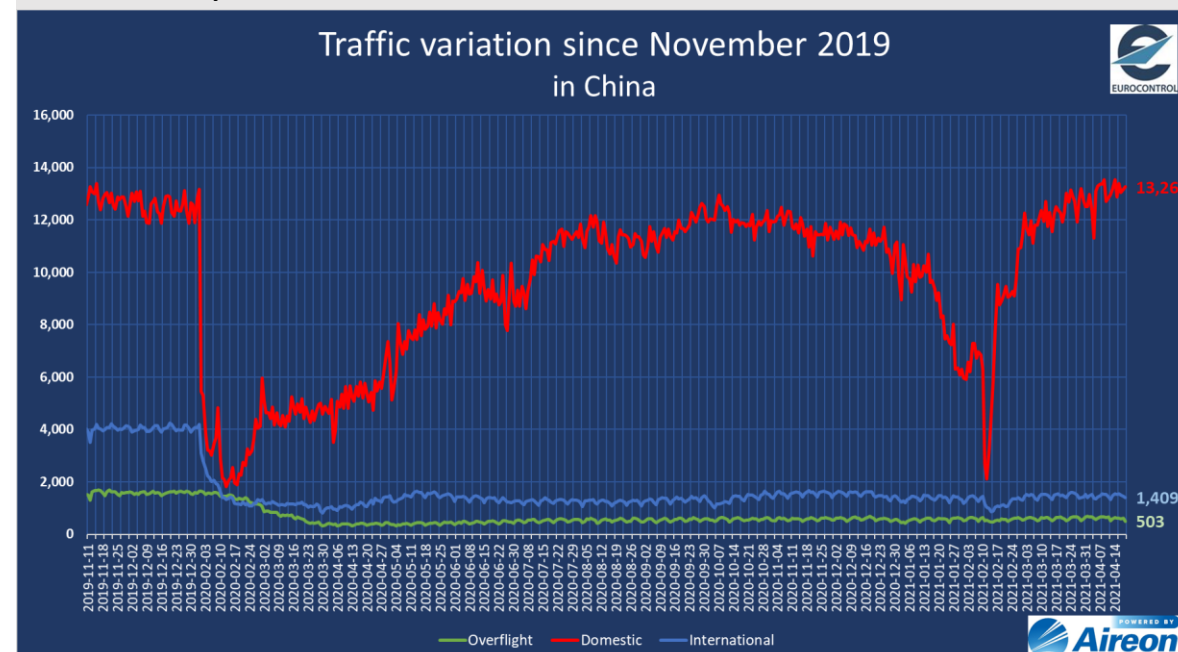
Middle East

- ✂ Intra-Middle-East traffic and international traffic from/to Middle-East recorded each 1,391 daily flights on 20 April (-45% and -46% compared to Feb 2020 respectively).
- ✂ Overflights have remained stable around 359 flights (-14% compared to Feb 2020) over the recent weeks.



China

- ✂ On 17 April, domestic traffic recorded 13,264 flights (+10% compared to January 2020 levels).
- ✂ International flights and overflights are still suppressed, they were stable on previous weeks with 1,409 and 503 flights respectively (-63% and -62% respectively vs 1 Jan 2020).
- ✂ The CAAC reported a passenger load factor of 66.2% in February 2021 vs 50.3% in Feb. 2020 vs 86.1% in Feb. 2019.

✂ 7 of top 10 airports decreased over 2 weeks, back to pre-Easter break traffic levels.

✂ Largest decrease for:

- **IGA Istanbul Airport (-16%)** mainly due to Turkish Airlines as well as domestic flows and flows with Russia.
- **Istanbul/Sabiha (-17%)** mainly due to Pegasus and Turkish Airlines as well as domestic flows and flows with Germany, Russia, Spain, Belgium and France.

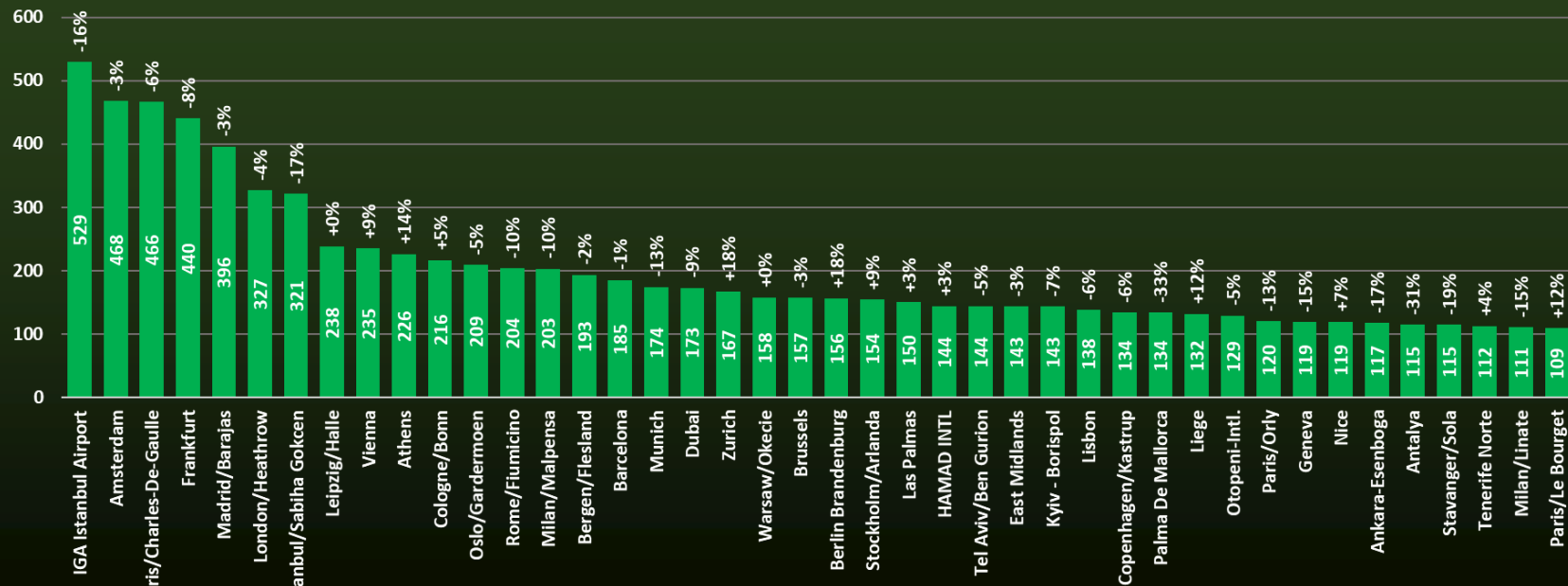
✂ Highest increase for Athens (+14%) mainly due to Olympic and many flows to Northern Europe.

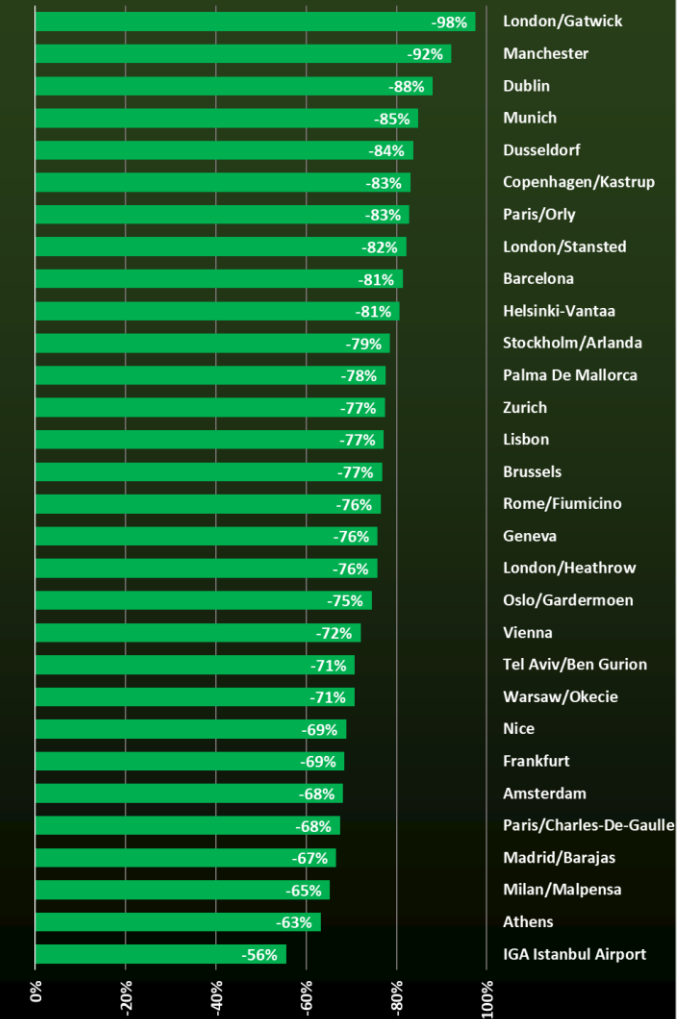

✂ Largest decreases for **IGA Istanbul** (-16%), **Istanbul/Sabiha** (-17%), **Palma de Mallorca** (-33%), **Antalya** (-31%) and **Frankfurt** (-8%).

✂ Traffic levels ranging from -987% (Gatwick) to -56% (Istanbul IGA) compared to 2019.

Daily Variation (IFR Dep/Arr Flights) - Wed 21 Apr 2021



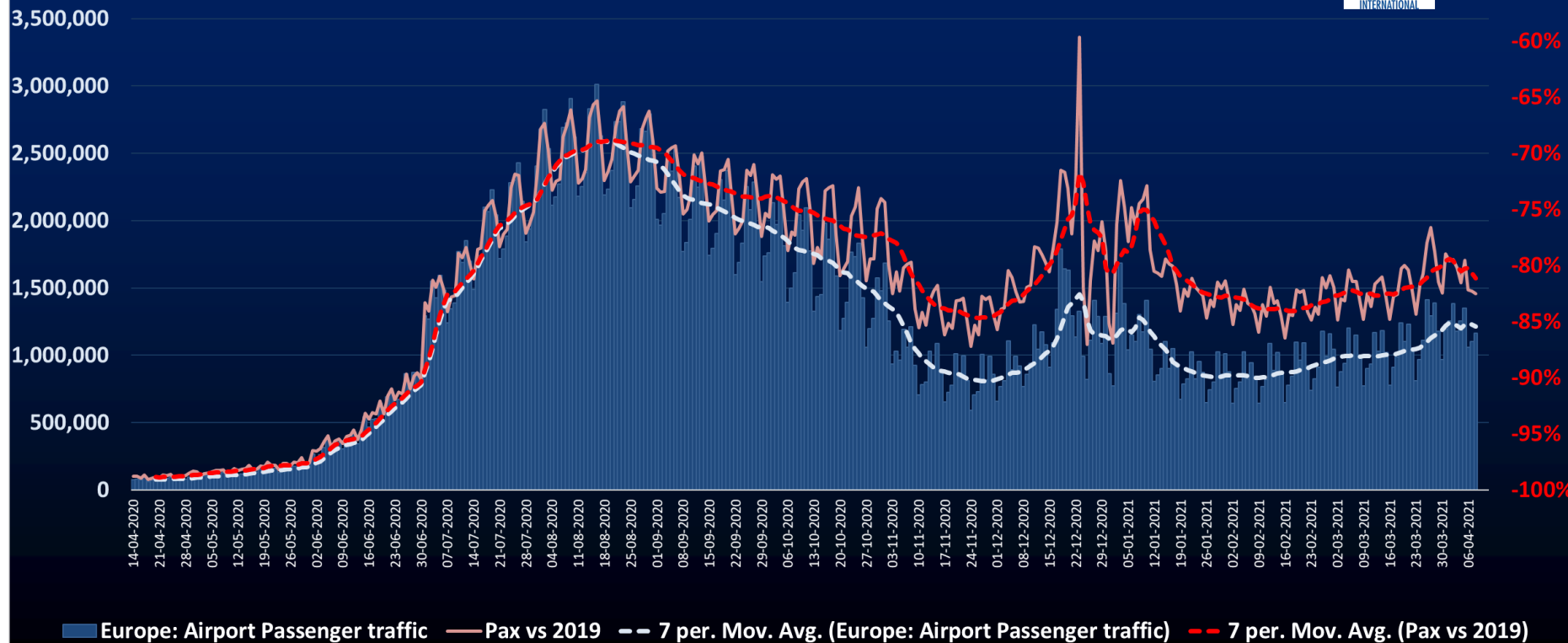


- ✂ **Amsterdam Schiphol Airport** reports March passenger numbers down 73.2% year-on-year to 660,372 (Europe -73.8%, intercontinental -72.5%); in March 2020 the numbers were 56.1% down (-58.4%/-50.4%) on 2019.
- ✂ **Copenhagen Airport** reports March passenger numbers down 82.5% year-on-year to 148,877 (domestic -36.6%, international -85.4%); in March 2020 the numbers were 59% down on 2019.
- ✂ **Cork Airport** reports that DHL Express is establishing a new route from Cork to Leipzig, initially using Boeing 767s leased from Condor; closing its principal runway for 10 weeks this autumn.
- ✂ **Gatwick Airport** to issue £300 million of 2.5% 11 year bonds.
- ✂ **Groupe ADP** reports March passenger numbers for its Paris airport network down 53% year-on-year to 1.3 million (domestic -37%, Europe -66%, other international -70%); in March 2020 the numbers were 64% down on 2019 (-58%/-64%/-53%).
- ✂ **Manchester Airports Group** are negotiating 'proposals to avoid further compulsory redundancies though new temporary pay and working arrangements for the year ahead'.

✈ **ACI** recorded just below 1.17 million passengers on 8 April 2021*, a **loss of 5.5 million passengers** compared to the equivalent day in 2019 (i.e. - **83%**).

✈ In January **2021**, **ACI Europe** reported **passenger traffic fell** by **80.3%** at European** airports (domestic: -62.5% and international: -86.2%).

✈ ACI has just issued a communication showing a downgrading of recovery forecasts due to “a deepening crisis” as air passenger traffic returns to rock bottom levels.

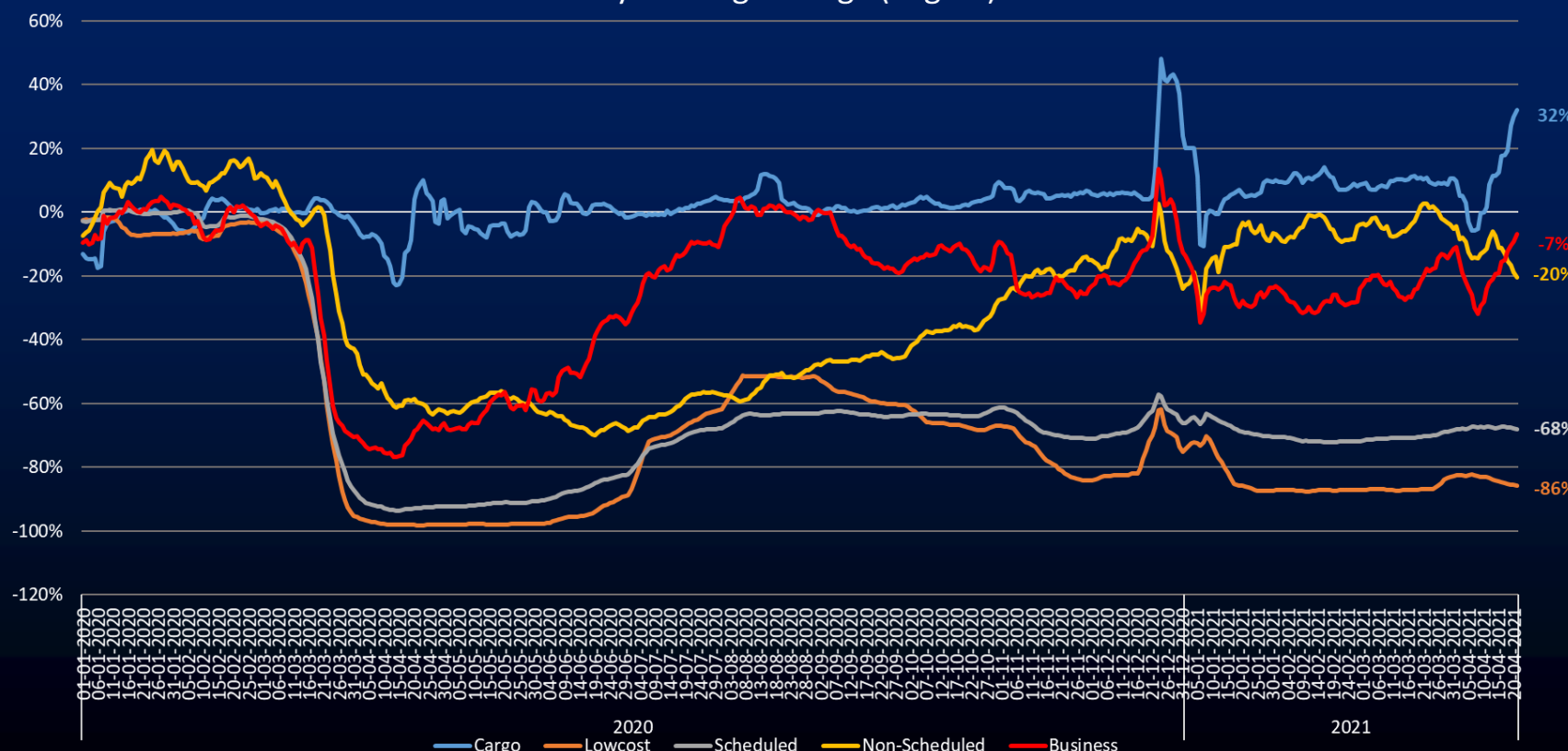

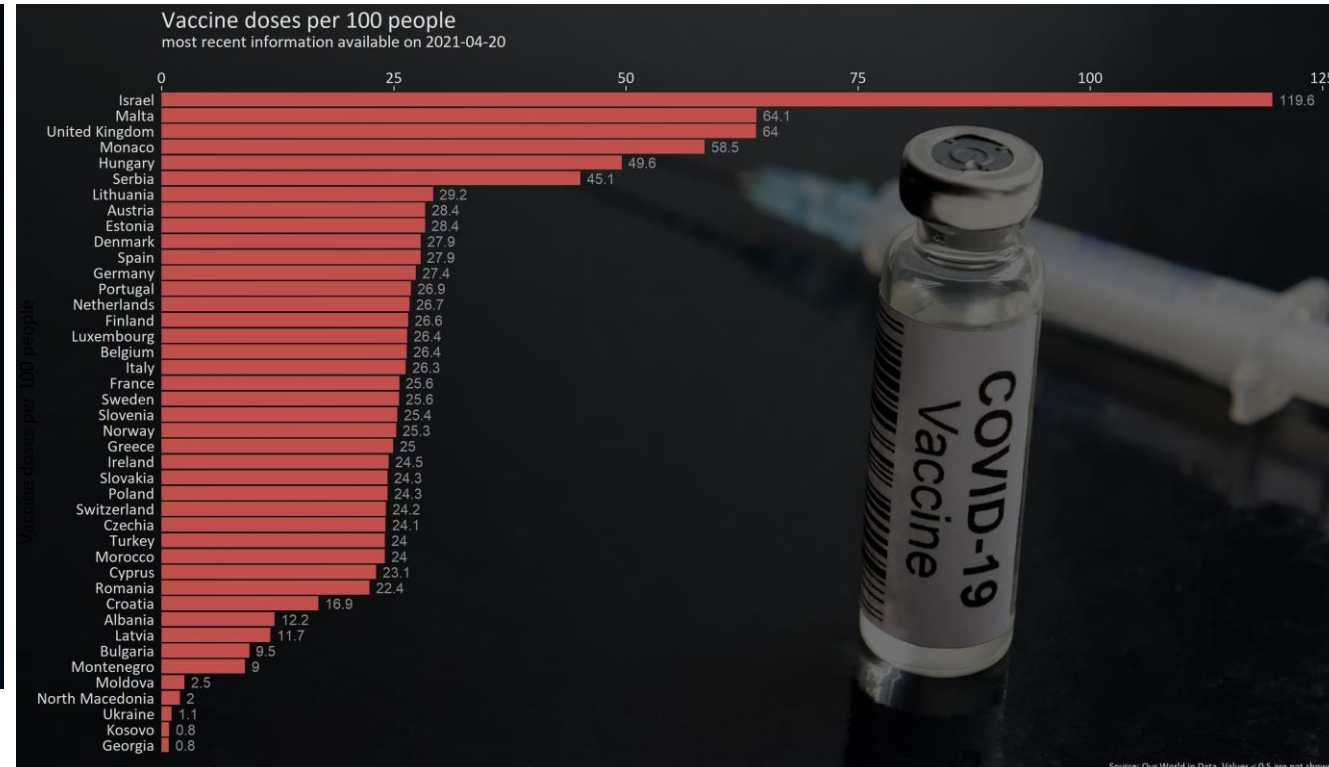
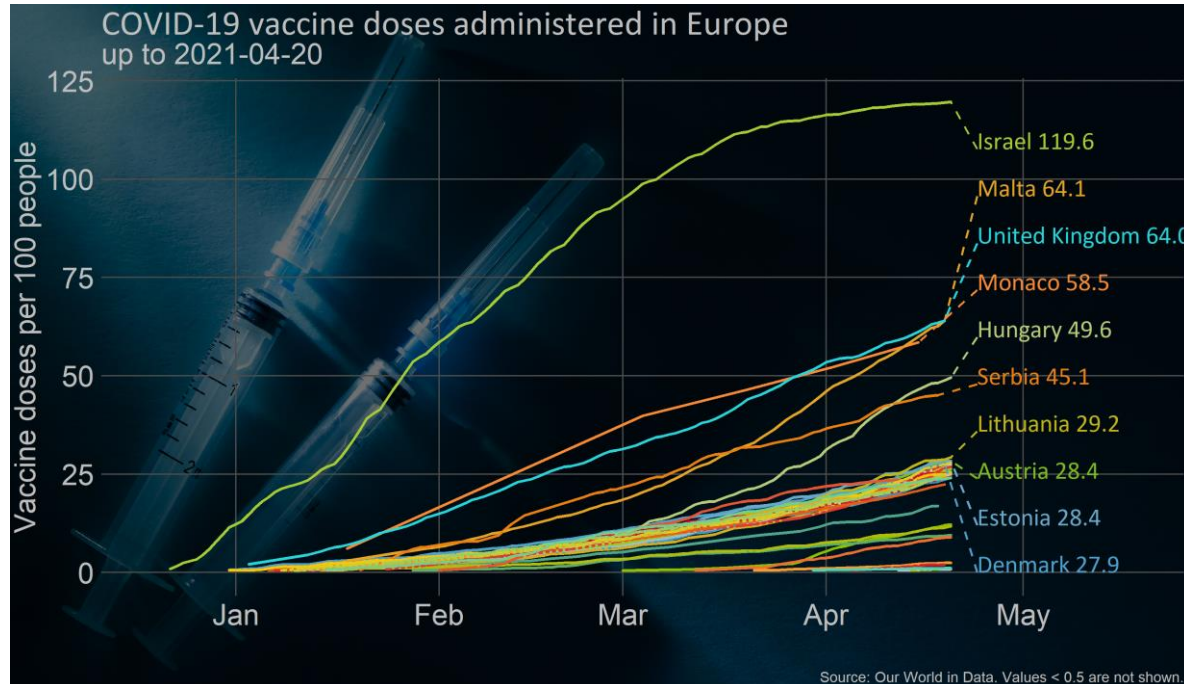
Market segments in EUROCONTROL Network

The evolution of the segments is now almost getting back to pre-Easter trends. On 21 April 2021, compared to 2019:

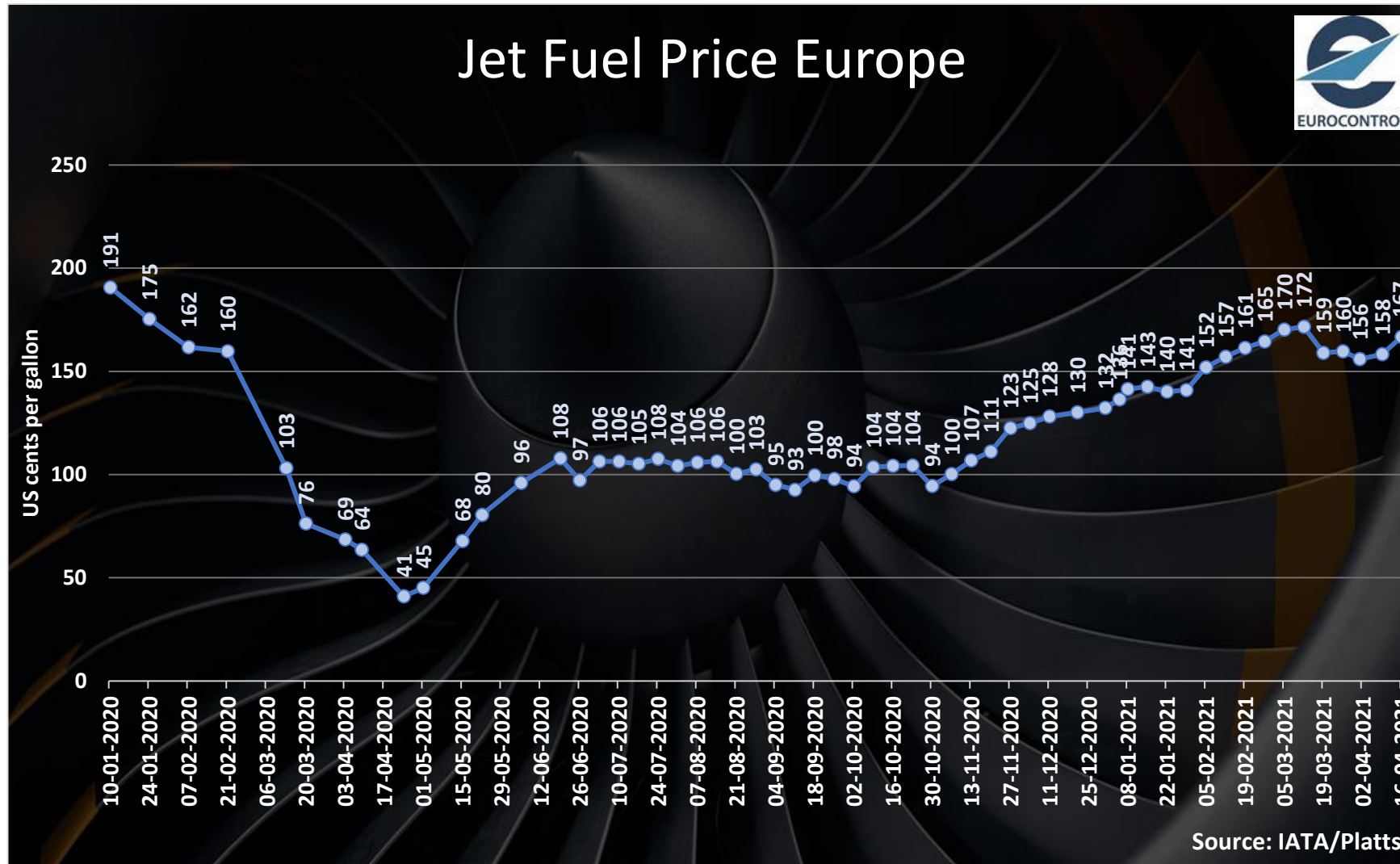
- ✘ **All-cargo** is the only segment increasing with **+32%**. This huge increase is clearly related to the Easter 2019 vs 2021 dates.
- ✘ **Charter** decreased to **-20%**.
- ✘ **Business Aviation** decreased to **-7%**.
- ✘ **Traditional** remained very stable, declining by **-68%**.
- ✘ After a minor blip over Easter, **Low-Cost** remains the most affected segment decreasing by **-86%** vs 2019.

Vaccination updates



- ✖ Inoculations against COVID-19 have started at the end of 2020 as shown with the daily number of COVID-19 vaccination doses administered per 100 people on the left hand-side graph.
- ✖ On the right hand-side one: around 23 States reported that more than 25 doses per hundred people have been administered by 20 April 2021 (vs 8 on 13 April 2021).

Graphs are showing data for the 41 Member and 2 Comprehensive Agreement States of EUROCONTROL.



✖ Jet fuel prices were stable since the beginning of March around 160 cts/gal and recorded an increase to **167 cts/gal** on 16 April 2021.

✖ Current prices are comparable to February 2020 levels, just before the COVID-19 outbreak start in Europe.
